(Purpose of Ordinance)

(The purpose of this ordinance is to update and clarify the Existing Regulations and to authorize the President and other Town officials and employees to take all action necessary to carry out the intent of this ordinance.)

Section 38-116: Enumeration.

It is declared a public nuisance and it is unlawful to maintain or to:

(13) Permit or allow graffiti to remain on real, personal, public or private property located within the public view, including, but not limited to, graffiti on motor vehicles and trailers. For purposes of this subsection, graffiti shall be defined as any sign, symbol, marking, drawing, name, initial, word, diagram, sketch, picture or letter placed upon real or personal property without the property owner's express, written permission.

Section 38-117: Abatement.

(b) To abate nuisances requiring the removal of garbage or graffiti, the provisions of 65 ILCS 5/11-20-13, along with all the powers, rights and duties contained therein, are incorporated by reference as if set out at length in this section. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Code to the contrary, any citation issued for graffiti located on a motor vehicle or trailer may be dismissed if the offender requests a hearing and provides proof to the town's hearing officer that the graffiti has been removed prior to the adjudication of the citation.

(d) Whenever a motor vehicle, which is an inoperable motor vehicle because such motor vehicle is not displaying valid license plates, a valid sticker indicating current registration, a valid transparent sticker license emblem issued by the town and/or is not properly licensed pursuant to this Code or when a motor vehicle or trailer constitutes a public nuisance because of the graffiti located thereon, is in plain view, the town may issue a ticket by:

(2) mailing the ticket to the registered owner of the inoperable motor vehicle if the inoperable motor vehicle is located on property that is not open and accessible to the town, in which case no entry by the town should be attempted. Any person violating section 38-116(12) may be fined not less than ~~\$50.00~~100.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense and each 24-hour period that a nuisance continues shall be considered a separate offense.

Section 94-3: Penalty for violation of chapter.

(a) Where no other penalty is provided in this chapter, any person violating any of the sections of this chapter or any rule or regulation made by the superintendent of police pursuant to this chapter shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than ~~\$25.00~~50.00 or more than \$750.00.

Section 94-181: Commercial vehicles and trucks prohibited from parking on certain designated streets; schedule XI.

In accordance with section 94-273 and when signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall at any time park any truck or commercial vehicle of any size or weight, except for loading and unloading, along the following streets:

~~Cermak Road, on both sides of the street, from Lombard Avenue to the Belt Line Railroad right-of-way, Laramie Avenue, the east side, commencing at the north property line of 2133 South Laramie Avenue and continuing south for a distance of 19.5 feet.~~

Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

Section 94-221: State codes adopted.

The Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq.), as amended, and the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act (625 ILCS 40/1-1 et seq.), as amended, are hereby adopted in their entirety. To the extent that any provision of the Illinois Vehicle Code or the Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act conflicts with the Town Code, the provisions of the Town Code shall control and prevail. In addition to those offenses enumerated in the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq.), as amended, the following shall constitute violations of this section:

(1) No valid registration or license plate

(2) Expired registration or license plate

(3) Improper display of license plates

(4) Improperly or fictitiously registered motor vehicle

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

~~Section 94-251: Prohibited in Specified Places.~~

~~(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall:~~

~~(1) Stop, stand or park a vehicle:~~

~~a. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street.~~

~~b. On a sidewalk.~~

~~c. Within an intersection.~~

~~d. On a crosswalk.~~

~~e. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 20 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by signs or markings.~~

~~f. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic.~~

~~g. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway or within a highway tunnel.~~

~~h. On any railroad tracks. A violation of this subsection shall result in a mandatory fine of \$500.00 or 50 hours of community service.~~

~~i. At any place where official signs prohibit stopping.~~

~~j. On any controlled access highway.~~

~~k. In the area between roadways of a divided highway, including crossovers.~~

~~l. In a public parking area if the vehicle does not display a current Cicero vehicle sticker, current temporary permit pending registration, or current parking pass.~~

~~m. Within 20 feet from the intersection of curblines or, if none, then within 15 feet of the intersection of property lines at an intersection, except at alleys.~~

~~n. In front of the exit of any theater, church or public building.~~

~~o. On a parkway.~~

~~p. Within any space set aside and visibly marked "no parking—police regulations."~~

~~q. Within any area on any street that the Superintendent of Public Works has posted by appropriate signs as a temporary no parking zone for the purpose of tree trimming, tree removal and/or street cleaning within such area. The town collector's office, upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this subsection, shall be authorized and directed to call upon the Department of Police to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.~~

~~r. Between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, within any school area which has been posted by appropriate signs as a school zone.~~

~~s. In the parking lot associated with the Metra Station located at 26th Street and Cicero Avenue, unless the person pays the required parking fee within two hours after initially parking his or her vehicle in the parking lot. Said fee may be paid on site or through a mobile application which allows for the remote payment of daily parking fees.~~

~~t. In the parking lot associated with Town Hall located at 4949 West Cermak Road which is reserved for certain town personnel, unless the office of the town collector issues a specialized parking permit to the owner of the vehicle. The parking permit must be prominently displayed in the windshield of the vehicle.~~

~~(2) Stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers:~~

~~a. In front of a public or private driveway.~~

~~b. Within five feet of a fire hydrant, except on any Major Street as defined in Section 94-280.~~

~~c. Within 15 feet of any fire hydrant on any Major Street, as determined necessary by the Fire Department, in which case, the safety zone shall be clearly marked.~~

~~d. Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection.~~

~~e. Within 20 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway, except on one way streets or roadways.~~

~~f. Within three feet upon the approach of any stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located on the side of a one way street or roadway, as determined necessary by the Town's Public Works Department. In the event that the Public Works Department determines that such a safety zone is required pursuant to this subsection, the safety zone shall be clearly marked.~~

~~g. Within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within 75 feet of such entrance, when properly signposted.~~

~~h. At any place where official signs prohibit standing.~~

~~(3) Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers:~~

~~a. Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing.~~

~~b. At any place where official signs prohibit parking.~~

~~(b) No person shall move a vehicle not lawfully under his control into any such prohibited area or away from a curb such distance as is unlawful. Reserved.~~

Section 94-251.1.A: Parking on Roadway.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle on the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.B: Parking on Sidewalk.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle on a sidewalk.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.C: Parking within an Intersection.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within an intersection.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.D: Parking within a Crosswalk.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within a marked crosswalk.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.E: Parking in a Safety Zone.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 20 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by signs or markings.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.F: Obstructing Traffic.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.G: Parking on a Bridge; Highway; Crossover.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle:

(1) Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway or within a highway tunnel;

(2) On any controlled access highway; or

(3) In the area between roadways of a divided highway, including crossovers.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.H: Parking on Railroad Tracks.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle on any railroad tracks.

(b) A violation of this subsection shall result in a mandatory fine of \$500.00.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.I: Parking in No Stopping/Standing Areas.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle at any place where official signs prohibit stopping or standing, exclusive of drop off lanes which are designated by posted signage.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.J: Parking in Front of a Theater, Church or Public Building.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in front of the exit of any theater, church or public building.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.K: Parking on Parkway.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle on any parkway.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.L: Parking in Violation of Police Order: Temporary No Parking Zone.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle within any space set aside and visibly marked "no parking—police regulations" or within any area on any street that the Superintendent of Public Works has posted by appropriate signs as a temporary no parking zone for the purpose of tree trimming, tree removal, street maintenance and/or street cleaning within such area.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.M: Metra Lots.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in the parking lot associated with the Metra Station located at 26th Street and Cicero Avenue, unless the person pays the required parking fee within two hours after initially parking his or her vehicle in the parking lot. Said fee may be paid on site or through a mobile application which allows for the remote payment of daily parking fees.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.1.N: Town Hall Reserved Parking Lot And Reserved Town Hall Parking Areas.

(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device and when signs are posted, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in the parking lot associated with Town Hall located at 4949 West Cermak Road or in the permit only parking areas located adjacent to Town Hall or in town-owned parking lots which are reserved for certain town personnel, unless the office of the town collector issues a specialized parking permit to the owner of the vehicle. The parking permit must be prominently displayed in the windshield of the vehicle.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.2.A: Private Driveways.

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers in front of a public or private driveway.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Upon the request of the property owner or tenant, any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.2.B: Hydrants; Fire lanes.

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers in front of or within five feet of a fire hydrant or fire lane, except on any Major Street as defined in section 94-280.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers in front of or within fifteen feet of any fire hydrant on any Major Street as defined in section 94-280, as determined necessary by the Fire Department, in which case, the safety zone shall be clearly marked.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$100.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.2.D: Traffic Control Devices.

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers:

(1) within 20 feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway, except on one-way streets or roadways; or

(2) within three feet upon the approach of any stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located on the side of a one-way street or roadway, as determined necessary by the Town's Public Works Department. In the event that the Public Works Department determines that such a safety zone is required pursuant to this subsection, the safety zone shall be clearly marked.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.2.E: Fire Stations.

(a) No person shall stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge passengers within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within 75 feet of such entrance, when properly signposted.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-251.3.A: Railroad Crossings.

(a) No person shall park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-252: Disabled persons' parking zones; loading and unloading zones.

(c) Any owner or operator of any motor vehicle without such special registration plates or a disabled parking identification card issued by the town who parks within a parking zone established for persons with disabilities shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$250.00 and no more than \$500.00. If requested by a town resident, and In addition to any fines authorized by this section, any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article.

(d) A physically disabled person or disabled veteran owning his or her own vehicle may apply to the office of the town collector to establish a parking zone for persons with disabilities on a public street in front of that person's place of residence if the place of residence does not have a driveway. ~~Such parking zone shall be limited to the vehicle owned and registered by the applicant and shall be no more than 20 feet in length.~~ Physically disabled persons and disabled veterans not owning their own vehicles and parents and guardians of disabled individuals under the age of 18 years of age, whose residence is not served by a driveway, may apply for a disabled person loading and unloading zone. Such loading and unloading zone shall be no more than four feet in length and shall be located on a public street in front of the applicant's place of residence. The office of the town collector shall investigate the application. Where the office of the town collector is satisfied in its reasonable discretion that the application meets all requirements established by the office of the town collector, the parking zone for persons with disabilities or the disabled person loading and unloading zone shall be established. Any vehicle which displays persons with disabilities license plates issued by the state, a valid disability parking placard issued by the state, or a valid town issued disabled parking identification card may park in any established parking zone for persons with disabilities on any public street within the town, subject to all other requirements set forth in this Code.

Section 94-255: Manner of parking; angle parking.

(d) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(e) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-256: Parking vehicle for sale.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to park upon a street, or any commercial property, other than a commercial property that is licensed for auto sales, any vehicle displayed for sale.

(b) Any person who violates this Section shall be fined \$750.00. Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for the first offense. Any person convicted of a subsequent offense shall be fined not less than \$250.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) In addition to any fines authorized by this Section, any vehicle parked in violation of this Section shall be subject to an immediate tow, without notice, in accordance with Division 7 of this Article.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, citations issued under this section may be issued in conjunction with, and not to the exclusion of, any citations issued for the operation of an automobile sales business without a license.

Section 94-257: Parking vehicles for displaying advertising.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or to park on any street any vehicle for the primary purpose of displaying advertising.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

Section 94-258: Stopping or parking in alleys.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any motor vehicle to stop upon or park within any alley within the corporate boundaries of the town; provided, however, that a vehicle may stop within an alley for the express purpose of either loading or unloading the contents carried by the vehicle, and when the loading or unloading has been accomplished, the vehicle must then be removed from the alley.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be subject to an immediate tow without notice in accordance with division 7 of this article. The towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

Section 94-259: ~~All night parking.~~

~~(a) Cermak Road. No person owning, controlling, driving or operating any vehicle shall park or cause or permit such vehicle to be parked on Cermak Road from its eastern boundary at 46th Avenue to its western boundary on Lombard Avenue on either side of the street between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any day. However, this subsection shall not apply to the following:~~

~~(1) Physicians on emergency cases;~~

~~(2) Any person owning, controlling, driving or operating an authorized emergency vehicle while engaged in emergency duty;~~

~~(3) Any duly licensed person owning, controlling, driving or operating a taxicab while the taxicab is standing at any taxicab stand fixed by ordinance; and~~

~~(4) Any person owning, controlling, driving or operating any vehicle that is used for the purpose of transporting goods, wares and merchandise while it is in the process of loading or unloading such goods, wares and merchandise.~~

~~(b) Roosevelt Road. No person owning, controlling, driving or operating any vehicle shall park or cause or permit such vehicle to be parked on the south side of Roosevelt Road from 61st Avenue to 59th Avenue between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on any day. Reserved.~~

Section 94-260: Bus loading zones.

(b) Any bus company or bus driver who fails or refuses or otherwise violates subsection (a) of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined no less than ~~\$5.00~~50.00 and no more than \$750.00, plus costs for each violation.

(d) Any owner or operator of any vehicle other than a bus who either drives upon or parks within a bus loading zone shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined no less than ~~\$2.00~~50.00 or more than \$750.00 plus costs for driving upon or parking within the bus loading zone.

(e) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing. (a) No person driving or in charge of a motor vehicle shall permit it to stand unattended without first stopping the engine, locking the ignition, removing the key from the ignition, effectively setting the brake thereon and, when standing upon any perceptible grade, turning the front wheels to the curb or side of the highway.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

~~When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets described in schedule I (section 94-171). Reserved.~~

Section 94-263: Prohibited in commercial loading zones.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(c) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(a) When signs are erected by the town ~~in each block~~ giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for longer than 15 minutes at any time between the hours specified in schedule III, the time restrictions set forth

~~thereon except for Sundays and public holidays, within the districts or upon any street or parts of streets described in schedules III (section 94-173).~~

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

(a) When signs are erected by the town in each block giving notice thereof, no person shall park any vehicle at any time between the hours specified as set forth on the signs in schedule IX (section 94-179), except persons who are actual residents of the town. ~~In addition to the hours listed in schedule IX and for streets in residential zones which are not included in schedule IX, no person, other than an actual resident of the town, shall park any vehicle at any time between the hours of 12:01 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.~~ Actual residents of the town includes persons who reside in the town and have registered their vehicle to a town address, people who regularly store or park a motor vehicle within the town and people who own, lease, or otherwise control property or a place of business where motor vehicles are stored, repaired, serviced, loaded, or unloaded in connection with such business and have a vehicle sticker as required by law. Any persons violating the provisions of this section shall upon conviction be fined not less than ~~\$25.00~~\$50.00 nor more than \$750.00 for each offense. (a) When signs are erected giving notice thereof, commercial vehicles or trucks are prohibited from parking, except to load or unload, on the streets or parts of streets described in schedule XI (section 94-181).

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

Section 94-274: Overnight truck parking prohibited; declaration of hazardous vehicles.

(a) No person shall park or store any truck, tractor, semitrailer, truck-tractor-semitrailer combination or any vehicle of the second division, as those terms are defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code, 625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq., on any street within the corporate limits of the town or in the parking lot commonly known as the L Strip located immediately north of and adjacent to the first alley north of Cermak Road and bounded by Central Avenue on the east and Lombard Avenue on the west between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

(c) Vehicles of the second division having a Class B registration are exempt from the provisions of this section if the vehicle does not have any of the following characteristics:

(2) Contains any commercial goods, construction equipment, snow removal equipment, landscaping equipment, trailer, construction materials, junk, scrap, materials destined to be recycled or any other commercial cargo, or;

(4) Additionally, vehicles used for work purposes by persons employed in a 24 hour on call capacity in medical, and heating/cooling, street maintenance and similar businesses are may be exempt from the provisions of this section subject to the approval of the town collector and so long as they have provided such information to the collector's office, in such form as requested by that office. The town collector may issue parking permits to exempt vehicles as described herein. ~~However, only one such vehicle per business is exempt from the provisions of this section.~~

(d) It shall be unlawful to park any tow truck or truck bearing a T/W registration or to permit a tow truck or truck bearing a T/W registration to remain parked at any time on any street located in a district zoned R-1 single-family residential, R-2 multifamily residential, or R-3 residential-commercial, except for the purposes of making a vehicle pickup, delivery or service call and then for a period not to exceed 30 minutes. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any town owned vehicle or any tow truck or truck bearing a T/W registration which is performing services for the town shall be exempt from this section.

(e) The penalty for violation of this section shall be a fine of not less than ~~\$75.00~~100.00 and not more than ~~\$200.00~~750.00 for each violation. (a) No person shall park or store any boat, boat trailer or boat and trailer combination on any town owned property, street or alley within the corporate limits.

(b) The penalty for violation of this section shall be a fine of not less than ~~\$50.00~~100.00 or more than \$750.00 for each violation. For purposes of this section, each eight-hour period any boat, trailer or boat and trailer combination is parked or stored in violation of subsection (a) of this section shall be considered a separate offense.

Section 94-275.A: Overnight Trailer Parking: Passenger Vehicles.

(a) No person shall park or store any trailer or passenger motor vehicle or motorcycle to which any trailer has been attached on any street or alley within the corporate limits of the town or in any municipally owned parking lot or garage between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

(b) The penalty for violation of this section shall be a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each violation.

(c) In addition to the penalties set forth in subsection (b) of this section, any vehicle parked in violation of this section is declared to be a hazardous vehicle and is subject to immediate tow without prior notice in accordance with the procedures for towing hazardous vehicles as set forth in division 7 of this article.

Section 94-276: Parking in municipal parking lots.

(c) All vehicles are prohibited from parking in all municipal parking lots and at all other property now or hereafter owned and/or controlled by the Town of Cicero, regardless of the designation of such property as a parking lot, for a period of time exceeding twenty-three (23) consecutive hours. Any vehicle parked in any municipal parking lot and at any other town owned property between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. must display a valid town parking license.

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.

~~(a) The board of trustees has the authority to close to vehicular traffic whatever streets in the town, in its judgment, it would be advisable to use for playground purposes during such times, days and hours that would~~

least inconvenience vehicular traffic in the particular locality and street and would best serve the children for playground purposes.

~~(b) No street shall be closed under permission and authority granted in this article, unless and until the trustees of the precinct wherein the street is located shall first consent in writing, signifying their willingness to have the street closed to vehicular traffic and to be used at certain times, days and hours for playground purposes, subject to the approval of the board of trustees.~~

~~Section 94-632: Closing to traffic.~~

~~(a) During the hours that any play street is in use for the purposes of recreation, as provided in section 94-631, the roadway thereof shall be closed to vehicular traffic by ropes or other removable barriers, and at each end of such section there shall be placed a standard or sign on which shall be painted in letters plainly legible for a distance of 100 feet a notice substantially in the following words:~~

~~It shall be the duty of the heads of the several departments of the town government and the town employees to render such assistance in the administration of the play street system as shall be necessary to ensure safety to the children using the play street. No games of a dangerous character shall be permitted upon any such play street, and no child of unsuitable age and no child who is affected with any communicable disease shall be permitted to join in such games without the permission of the commissioner of public health. No hard ball shall be used on any such play street, nor shall football, shinny, high jumping or broad jumping be permitted thereon. Rope jumping, dancing, roller skating, indoor baseball, ring games and other like games that do not render such play streets unsafe for small children may be permitted under proper supervision.~~

~~Section 94-571: Use of residential streets; speed limit.~~

~~(e) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.~~

~~Section 106-40: No Vehicle Tag; Expired Vehicle Tag. -Payment of fees; penalty for late payment.~~

~~(a) Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in a public parking area within the town reserved for residents if the vehicle does not display a current Cicero vehicle sticker, current temporary permit pending registration, or current parking pass. The vehicle sticker must be affixed to the lower righthand corner on the inside of the glass of the windshield of such motor vehicle approximately two inches from the right-hand side and approximately two inches above the bottom of the frame of such windshield.~~

~~(ab) All vehicle license fees shall be due and payable on or before June 30 on July 1 of each year. If any person fails or refuses to obtain a license as required by this article for any vehicle before on or after July 1 of the year in which the license is due, a penalty of \$50.00/100.00 per vehicle shall be added to the license fee. Every vehicle which is registered within the corporate limits of the town shall be required to obtain a license and shall not be permitted to utilize any parking pass in lieu of a license.~~

~~(bc) No penalty shall be charged to an applicant who has purchased a vehicle after July 1 of the year in which the license is due and who shall make application for a vehicle license within 30 days after such purchase.~~

(ed) Any person who shall fail or refuse to obtain the vehicle license as required by this article by the deadline date contained in this section or who stops, stands or parks a vehicle in violation of subsection (a) above shall be fined not less than ~~\$50.00~~100.00 and not more than \$500.00 for each offense.

(e) Authorized town officials and employees upon finding vehicles parked in violation of this section, shall be authorized and directed to enforce this subsection by ticketing or towing, if necessary and so long as the towing complies with the provisions of section 94-280 of this Code, and the issuance of arrest notices, and the towing charges in each case shall be borne by the owner of the vehicle.

The sticker emblem shall contain the word "Cicero," the year for which the vehicle sticker is valid, the expiration date of the vehicle sticker, the name of the town president, and the name of the class to which such vehicle belongs, ~~and a number which shall match the number on the completed application form.~~ When such transparent sticker emblem is delivered to the applicant, it shall be the duty of such applicant to affix the emblem in the lower righthand corner on the inside of the glass of the windshield of such motor vehicle approximately ~~one~~ two inches from the right-hand side and approximately ~~one~~ two inches above the bottom of the frame of such windshield.

(b) Any person who shall take, destroy, obliterate, any such current transparent sticker license emblem shall be fined not less than ~~\$100.00~~50.00 or more than \$750.00 for each offense, and each and every such wrongful destruction, obliteration, or removal of such license emblem from any vehicle shall be considered as a separate offense. Any person who fails to display a sticker license emblem in accord with the provision of this chapter shall be fined not less than ~~\$25.00~~50.00 or more than \$100.00 for each offense. For purposes of this section, each 24-hour period that a vehicle is parked or used without a license emblem or that displays a counterfeit sticker license emblem shall be considered a separate offense, and each and every time an individual or entity copies, photocopies, reproduces, falsifies or in any way creates or displays a fraudulent or altered license emblem shall be considered a separate and distinct offense.

~~(c) Beginning in June of 2001, the town vehicle stickers issued for vehicles registered to addresses located south of Ogden Avenue, including addresses on the south side of Ogden Avenue, shall have a different shape than the vehicle stickers issued for addresses located north of Ogden Avenue, including addresses on the north side of Ogden Avenue. In addition, town vehicle stickers issued to addresses located in designated, special parking either the Morton High School or Morton College zones, defined in section 94-196, will contain an additional color or symbol designating their location within one of the zones.~~

Section 106-429: Unlicensed parking prohibited.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to park or store any motor vehicle or trailer upon any town owned parking lot or other town property or upon any street or alley within the corporate limits unless there is displayed upon such motor vehicle or trailer a valid and current license or temporary registration issued under the provisions of the Illinois Motor Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq.).

(b) Any person convicted of violating this section shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$750.00 for each offense.
