Cicero Celebrates Armed Services Day, Honors WWII Veteran

Cicero officials and residents came together on May 24 to commemorate Armed Services Day, paying tribute to military veterans who have served their country. The event's highlight was a special recognition of centenarian veteran Benito Morales, who turned 100 on June 9.

Morales, a distinguished World War II veteran, was honored for his remarkable service and bravery during the conflict. He was awarded the prestigious Bronze Star for his heroic actions in Erpel, Germany while serving with the 39th Infantry Regiment of the 9th Infantry Division. During a Nazi attack, Mr. Morales fearlessly rescued 11 injured soldiers under enemy fire. In recognition of his exceptional valor and heroism, his Bronze Star was recently upgraded to include a V for Valor and Heroism.

Furthermore, in 2017, Benito Morales was bestowed with the French Legion of Honor, the highest decoration for bravery awarded by the French Government. The ceremony occurred at the American Legion Manual Perez Jr Post 1017 in Chicago, an establishment named in honor of his late military colleague and friend.

"Cicero holds great pride in the dedication and sacrifice exhibited by all its veterans throughout the years, from World War I to the present day," Town President Larry Dominick said. "We are incredibly proud to honor veterans such as Benito Morales, who exemplify greatness through their courage and selflessness, regardless of personal safety."

Benito Morales' 100th birthday celebration comes with the added honor of the Board of Trustees resolution, passed on April 25, expressing deep gratitude for Morales' service and bestowing the town's highest honors upon him.

The town presented the resolution to Morales and his family as a testament to its deep respect for his exceptional achievements, unwavering courage, and unwavering dedication.

Cicero Hosts Inaugural Men's Health Event

Town President Larry Dominick and Cicero's Health Department hosted the inaugural Men's Health Event on June 15 at the Cicero Community Center. Vanessa Parrish, Director of Health Management, and Laura Rubio, the newly appointed Health Department Director, joined forces to organize this event focusing on men's health.

Cicero's male residents underwent free health screenings tailored to their needs and complimentary haircuts and nail trimmings provided by Bell-Mar Beauty College.

"We advise men to do the health screenings because they are beneficial, and people should take advantage of those services," Rubio said.

The health screenings encompassed specialized labs, podiatry assessments, dental exams, blood pressure measurements, and height, weight, and BMI calculations. Director Rubio explained that at the end of their experience, men could check out with a nurse practitioner who provided recommendations regarding their screenings.

"We're really pleased to have the opportunity to address another area of our community that can truly benefit from our services," Parrish said. She further emphasized the department's commitment to catering to various health concerns within the community. "We are very enthusiastic about addressing all areas of health as we continue to grow and provide the necessary information and services to support our community's needs."

The event started with a bilingual informational session on male-focused health aspects, delivered by Dr. Daniel Corredor in Spanish and English. Corredor highlighted the significance of raising awareness about men's health, especially during June, recognized as Men's Health Month. He emphasized the importance of regular follow-up and communication with doctors.

"These health problems can be prevented with regular follow-up and talking to your doctor. With some prevention and knowledge, we can make health more accessible and provide tools to manage one's health

Call the Cicero Department of Housing first, to see if you qualify for the Emergency Cooling Program. If so, a technician will be sent to your home within 24 hours to repair or replace the unit, and we cover costs up to \$4,999.00.
