Fired Department Installs Child Safety Seats

The Town of Cicero Fire Department recently underwent training to ensure the proper installation of car seats, launching a new initiative to bolster community support.

On March 7, 2024, car seat trainers from Rush Copley visited the firehouse at 5303 West 25th Street, providing complimentary car seats and instructing Cicero firefighters and police officers on correct installation procedures.

Assistant Fire Chief Steve Schwarz emphasized the importance of child safety, stating, "It's good for the community. It's good to make sure we know we're putting kids in safely."

Residents were encouraged to register beforehand for this free program. By 12:30 p.m., several vehicles had queued up, with Rush Copley trainers guiding firefighters and police officers through installation techniques.

Claire Pfotenhauer, the Regional Traffic Safety Liaison for Rush Copley through IDOT, elucidated, "The class is administered through Rush Copley and it's a nationally certified child passenger safety technician course." Pfotenhauer highlighted the prevalence of incorrect car seat usage, noting its potentially fatal consequences in accidents.

The training encompassed checks for recalls and ensured that residents possessed the appropriate car seats. Pfotenhauer emphasized the role of certified technicians in educating caregivers on proper installation and seat suitability for children.

The department aims to have at least one trained firefighter or police officer available per shift to address car seat installation concerns.

Firefighter Adam Lavery elaborated, "Today we're doing safety inspections. Parents are coming to have their child safety seat device checked to make sure it's properly installed."

Residents also received training to install car seats independently if required.

The Cicero Fire Department remains committed to assisting residents with car seat installations. Individuals can contact Cicero Town Hall at 708-656-3600 extension 103 for inquiries or appointments and request Assistant Fire Chief Steve Schwartz.
