Dominick's Policies Continue to Create New Jobs Through New Businesses

The Cicero Health Department provides a wide range of services under Sue Grazzini, Health Director. Many of those services are free or low-cost for residents. And Cicero is proud of the many new and improved parks for our community and the state-of-the-art animal shelter, Waggin' Tails, supervised by Director Erika Rosales.

All of these improvements have served to attract new businesses to our community, creating thousands of new jobs.

Cicero Announces Zoning Open House

The Town of Cicero invites residents to attend a public open house at 6 pm on August 23 at the Cicero Council Chambers. The open house will provide an informal opportunity to learn more about and ask questions about the proposed changes to the town's zoning and development regulations.

For over the past year, the town, through the Zoning Steering Committee, has been working with the Savoy Consulting Group to prepare an update to the town's development regulations and zoning map as part of a new Unified Development Code (UDC). This was made possible with funding and technical support from the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA). The UDC builds upon the recommendations outlined in relevant Town planning efforts, including the 2017 Comprehensive Plan, 2014 Cicero Avenue Corridor Plan, and 2014 Cicero Connections Transit Area Implementation Plan.

A Unified Development Code (UDC) is a document in which traditional zoning and subdivision regulations are combined with other desired town regulations such as sign requirements, design guidelines, and water management. Visit this CMAP video to learn more about understanding zoning and subdivision regulations. By combining all of these regulations in a single document, a UDC is intended to streamline the development process and simplify the process for certain permits and zoning approvals. The result is that all required permits, processes, and regulations are outlined in one place, making it easier for developers and the public to understand the requirements.

A few of the significant changes to the town development regulations include:

- Promoting walkability and transit-oriented development (TOD) near transit stations.
- Adopting a new set of zoning districts that better align with the recommendations of the Town Comprehensive Plan, including a corresponding update to the Town Zoning Map.
- Adopting the Form-Based zoning code design

standards, currently in place for properties along the Roosevelt Road corridor, to apply to all business zoning districts.

- Allowing projecting business signs under strict design guidelines, similar to what is allowed in other nearby communities.
- Providing various parking and loading exceptions, credits, and accommodations to both minimize the burden on existing and new businesses, as well as control commercial parking in residential areas.
- Giving the zoning administrator more authority to review and approve minor zoning variations, thereby greatly reducing the time and expense for all property owners.
- Adding standards for the amount of outdoor lighting that is allowed in all areas of the community to minimize the negative impact on adjacent uses.
- Adding impervious coverage limits in residential zoning districts to reduce flooding and maintain green space.
- Adding landscape standards for all new construction and expansions to buildings that exceed 10 percent of the existing floor area.
- Making it easier for owners of non-conforming homes to expand and improve their property.
