Cicero Commemorates Pulaski Day with Guest Speaker

Cicero commemorated Pulaski Day with guest speaker Appellate Court Judge Aurelia Pucinski at a special event focused on Polish nationality and history on March 8 at the Cicero Community Center.

"We are always proud to have these events looking at culture, ethnicity and history," said Cicero spokesman Ray Hanania. President Larry Dominick proudly celebrates all the many ethnic communities in Cicero.

Hanania introduced Cicero Chaplain Ismael Vargas for the opening prayer before welcoming Anthony Grazzini, the Elementary School District 99's Director of Grants and Accountability, who served as emcee for the event.

"First, I would like to thank President Larry Dominick for having these monthly gatherings. We're excited to share the culture and heritage of Cicero and learn a little bit about the history of our country and the people who made our country pretty powerful," Grazzini said.

Grazzini welcomed Pucinski, a well-known figure in Cook County, being a part of the Houby Day Parade, teaching at Chicago Public Schools, and becoming an advocate for children throughout her legal career.

"She has had that kind of fight living inside for her whole life," he said.

Pucinksi spoke to the students who attended the program, asking if anyone wanted to become lawyers, encouraging them to study law and ultimately run to become a judge.

"I am very happy to be an elected Justice of the Appellate Court," she said. She served as Clerk for the Cook County Circuit Court and Circuit Court Judge before her election as Appellate Court Judge in 2010.

"I would like to start by pointing out that I am well aware that Cicero, a wonderful town, is really a beautiful blend of different ethnic groups," Pucinski said. "But each person in any ethnic group in Cicero has that immigrant experience somewhere in their

family history. And that immigrant experience takes, above all, courage, and that is one of the reasons we celebrate Casimir Pulaski. Not only to celebrate the way he lived but also to respect the way he died," said Justice Pucinski.

Pulaski, born in Warsaw, served in the Continental Army and is often credited as the founder of the American Calvary. He died in Georgia during the American Revolution and is one of eight honorary American citizens.

"What really makes us admire Pulaski is his fierce commitment to freedom and independence," Pucinski said. "Pulaski did not have to take up the fight for independence in America. He was a soldier, and he knew how to fight. We are blessed that he chose to use those skills to secure the freedom and independence we have today."

Illinois is the only state to celebrate Pulaski Day as an offiicial government holiday, most popularly celebrated in Chicago. The United States honors the Polish leader with a General Pulaski Memorial Day in October, to commemorate the anniversary of his death. It has been a US holiday since 2008.

Fire Station Receives New Sutphen Fire Engine

Cicero's Morton Park Fire Station, 5303 West 25th St., received the latest Sutphen fire engine in February as part of a movement to modernize the department and save the town money on repairs and other maintenance.

"Our department was a bit overdue for a rig or two. (This fire engine) is the first of two new rigs that President Dominick approved. In the future, we are also getting a new truck," said Fire Chief Jeff Penzkofer. "Our other engine was serviceable. It was good, but overtime, the maintenance and the many repairs were an inconvenience for everybody. Now that we have a new engine, it's like having a brandnew car. There shouldn't be any problems."

The Cicero Fire Department has three fire stations, located: 5303 W. 25th St, 601 S. Central Ave, and 5410 W. 34th St.

"As you know, Cicero is a bustling town with a dense population, so we want something very dependable. Even though our other rigs were dependable, they used up their life span. With a new engine, we can confidently roll to all our calls," Penzkofer said.

Not to be confused with fire trucks, the new fire engine carries all the tools, the jaws of life, ladders, cribbing, and everything else needed to open up holes. Penzkofer said the new engine is known as a pumper, meaning it can carry water with all the required hoses.

The Cicero Fire Department's mission statement is: "To protect and preserve the life and property of the Cicero residents through community outreach, education, and high-quality professional emergency services." The fire department will continue to keep Cicero safe thanks to the new engine.

Hyundai Motor Group Donates Security Bars to Police Department

Hyundai Motor Group, the parent company of Kia and Hyundai, donated anti-theft devices to the Cicero Police Department. The donation came about after an increase in motor vehicle thefts. Thieves targeted Kia and Hyundai vehicles that do not have a push button ignition.

"We held an event in which we gave away anti-theft devices with steering wheel locks for any owners who had vehicles between 2015 and 2021," said First Deputy Superintendent Luis Gutierrez. "We gave out approximately 50. We're grateful to Hyundai Motor Group's donation and will continue to provide those anti-theft devices to our residents in the coming weeks."

The joint effort made by the motor companies along with the Cicero police department is to minimize thefts.

Any Cicero resident interested in obtaining one of these free anti-theft devices must contact the Cicero Police Department.

"The only thing that we need is to verify that they are a registered owner here in the Town of Cicero, have a Kia (and Hyundai) that's between the years 2015 and 2021, doesn't have a push button start, and that they do have a valid Town of Cicero City Sticker," Gutierrez said.




