Three Kings Returns to Cicero

After pandemic surges canceled last year's celebration, the Three Kings celebration returned to Cicero Stadium on January 6 to great fanfare.

The annual event, presented by Town President Larry Dominick and the Town Board of Trustees, has been organized by Trustee Victor Garcia since its inception.

"It hadn't been celebrated (in Cicero) until President Dominick came to office, and we are proud of his support," Garcia said. "It's an important holiday for the Hispanic community and, with this being Epiphany, all of Christianity."

The Three Kings celebration focuses on the passage in Matthew when the magi, or wise men, visited Jesus in Judea sometime after his birth in the 1st Century AD. Tradition holds that at least three of them – Bethlazar, Caspar, and Melchior – journied from the east to the small country inside the Roman Empire. For Christians, especially Roman Catholics, Lutherans, Methodists and Episcopalians, this marks the holiday of Epiphany and the end of the Christmas holiday. For several Latin traditions, this is also the traditional gift–giving holiday since the magi were the ones who presented Jesus with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

In Cicero, the celebration includes live music, youth dance groups, Rosca de Reyes, and a gift for every child who attends.

"Our event is one of only a few held (in the area), so we had a good turnout. It was the only one in Cicero. Every child left with a big smile, and they received several gifts," Garcia said. "We did our best to keep it a family event and focused on the children."

Included with the gifts were books geared toward their reading levels to help promote literacy.

Garcia wasn't the only one on hand celebrating the day with residents. Cook County Commissioner Frank Aguilar was on hand to hand out gifts and enjoy the reenactment of the magi visiting Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

"This is an important event in our community, and I am proud to support it in the Cicero and throughout Cook County," Aguilar said.

Seniorita Cicero Queen Natalie Baeza also attended. She will soon be competing for the Miss Illinois crown. Joining the leaders were Clerk Maria Punzo-Arias, Supervisor Joe Virruso, Collector Emilio "Emo" Cundari, Collector Fran Reitz, and trustees Bob Porod, John Cava and Blanca Vargas.

Cicero Remembers Dr. King's Legacy at Ceremony

Cicero honored the life and legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., on Jan. 11 at the Cicero Community Center. The annual commemoration is a part of a series of events celebrating the diversity of the town's residents throughout the year. The King event has been a part of the town's traditions since Town President Larry Dominick first became president in 2006.

The program featured the remarks of Cicero officials, Morton 201 students Ana Henderson and Adriana, and Pastor Curtis Butler. Butler served as the keynote speaker and was introduced by Pastor Shando Valdez, a senior adviser to Dr. Willie Wilson, a candidate for Chicago mayor.

"Dr. King dreamed of a world where everyone would get along and not be judged by the color of their skin. This led to giving a speech where he called for civil and economic rights and to end racism in the United States," Henderson said in her presentation.

Harris continued the remarks on King's legacy by later saying, "Martin Luther King was a non-violent civil rights leader in the 1950s and 1960s. King's overall goal was that everyone would be equal, no matter your race or stature. His 1963 speech I have a Dream Speech impact people around the world. King will always be remembered for the impact he had around the world."

Butler, a pastor at the Chicago Embassy Church Network, discussed King's importance in helping to confront racial discrimination and bring the country together.

"When I think of Martin Luther King, Jr., I think of someone who was a son of America, a natural son of America. His ancestors, like many of yours and mine, were not born on this American soil. He was the son of former slaves," Butler said. "Martin Luther King understood that the chains of bondage and the heat of oppression had fused our blood with this American soil. Even though our ancestors were not born on these lands, Martin Luther King understood he was a son of America naturally."

Valdez took a moment to tie Dr. King's vision with Wilson's background.

"Dr. Wilson is a man who has an amazing story that

coincides with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s vision; that it doesn't matter where you come from, what color you may be, the background you may have, the truth of the matter is this: in America, all people from all places have an opportunity to do great things," Valdez said. "I am here to speak to you about Dr. Willie Wilson's story, which starts out in the fields in Louisiana as a cotton picker. Someone who literally lived in poverty. He faced challenge after challenge after challenge...he was inspired by Dr. King to turn his life around and become successful."

Morton 201 Superintendent Timothy Truesdale emceed the event and Cicero Chaplain Ismael Vargas provided opening prayers. Cicero School District 99 students also attended the commemoration, as was the district's board chairman, Tom Tomschin. Cicero Library's Executive Director Sandra Tomschin and Morton 201 educators Erica Hade, Kathryn Reichel, Luis Castanon and Claudia Campos appeared.

Cicero Accepting Fire Department Applications

The Town of Cicero is accepting applications for firefighters and paramedics from qualified individuals for the Fire Department.

The starting salary for Firefighter/Paramedic is \$74,448.61. Applicants must be between 21 and 34 years of age at the time of the application submission and meet a series of requirements.

Applicants must be US citizens and have at least 30 credit hours at an accredited college, university or junior college at the time of application. Applicants will also be asked to submit copies of their high school graduation or GED diplomas.

Applicants must have no felony convictions. They must have a driver's license, a good driving record, and 20/20 vision.

Applicants must also present a valid CPAT card with ladder climb (date must be within 12 months of the application deadline), possess a valid Paramedic License from the State of Illinois Department of Health (IDPH), and possess a firefighter I or basic operation firefighter (BOF) certification from the Office of the State Fire Marshal of Illinois.

Applicants that receive a tentative offer of employment will be required to test successfully into

the Loyola EMS system before start date. They will also be required to attend an orientation and take a written examination scheduled for Saturday, March 18, at 9:00 am, with oral interviews conducted on Monday, March 27, beginning at 6:00 pm.

The deadline to apply is Wednesday, February 15, 2023.

If you are an owner of an owner-occupied home in Cicero, and you were negatively effected by the Covid-19 Pandemic, you may qualify for water bill relief (up to \$500.00).

- 3. You must have been impacted by the Pandemic,

- 5. Your household must fall within the income guidelines (below),



Hear These Words? Hang Up!

Imposter fraud—in which criminals pretend to be law enforcement, government officials, or other authorities—is not the number 1 type of fraud in America. The better you are at recognizing it, the safer you become.

Scanario 1

"Hello, sir. This is Amazon Security calling to inform you that there has been an attempt to order items on your account. Do not worry, we can help with the refund. I just need a few pieces of information from you to get the refund started."

Scanario 2

"This is Agent Smith from the IRS. I am calling to inform you that you have a federal warrant for your arrest due to not paying your taxes. Please press 1 on your keypad to be connected to my desk so we can clear up this matter."

Scenario 3

"This is the Social Security
Administration, and your Social Security
check has been frozen due to fraudulent
activity. Press 1 to take care of this
matter."

When you should hang up:

Scenario 1: Hang up when asked for info to access your bank or other private accounts remotely. If you think there could be a problem, go directly to your Amazon account and contact the company directly through the website.

Scenario 2: Hang up on any call you believe is coming in as a computerized robocall. IRS employees never demand money or threaten you over the phone. They may call to set up appointments or discuss audits, but only after trying to notify you by mail.

Scenario 3: Hang up when any government official says you need to pay money over the phone or asks you for personal information. That doesn't happen.
