Cicero Celebrates Lithuanian Independence Day

Cicero celebrated Lithuanian immigrant settlement and the Baltic country's independence with a commemoration held at the Cicero Community Center on February 15.

Cicero officials and community leaders honored Lithuanian Independence Day and President's Day at the event, featuring remarks by Lithuanian activist Alvida Baukus. Baukus is the daughter of longtime Lithuanian community leader Mindy Baukus. Alvida Baukus presented an overview of Lithuanian culture and heritage dating back over 700 years.

"Even before Lithuania declared its independence the first time on February 16, 1918, many Lithuanians had already called Cicero home. They immigrated here significantly after the Second World War and even after the re-establishment of the Democratic State of Lithuania on March 11, 1990," Baukus said. "Once again, it is a privilege to jointly share the commemorations of Presidents Day and the restoration of Lithuanian Independence."

Baukus introduced Milda Satas, president of the Cicero Lithuanian Community, and also expressed her gratitude to President Dominick, the Cicero Board and the community for recognizing Lithuanian contributions to the Town of Cicero. Joining Satas and Baukus were Audra Bernotavicius, Gintare Janus, Ramutis and Nijole Rubas, Mindaugas Bielskus, Saulius and Roma Kuprys, and Virgis Rukuiza.

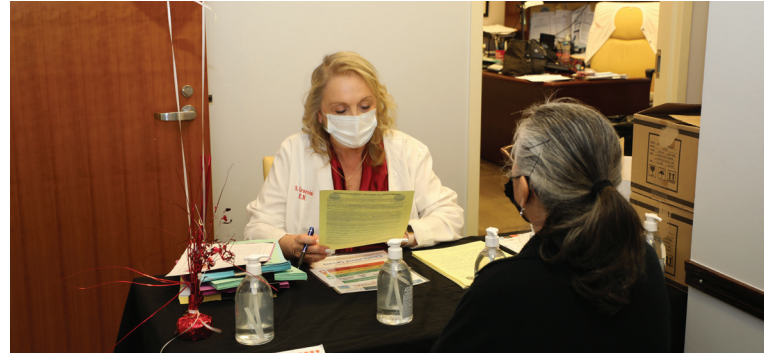
Health Department Showcases Services at Healthy Hearts

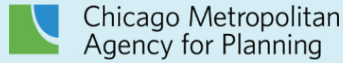

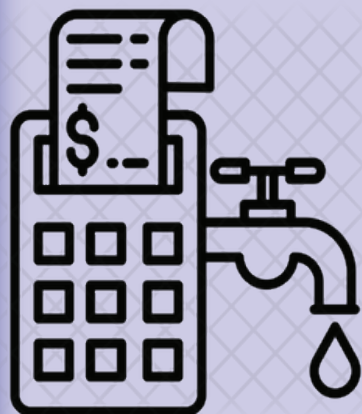

Here are the Facts on What the Government Does and Doesn't Do:

- 1.** The federal government will not call you unsolicited and ask for personal information. Government agencies already have your details related to your Medicare and Social Security numbers.
- 2.** Any important communications from the federal government usually come via the United States Postal Service.
- 3.** No federal government agency will initiate serious contacts with you via social media, text, or email.
- 4.** The government will not reach out to you to offer you a federal grant. Grants require an application, and they are always for a specific purpose
- 5.** No government office will ask you for an upfront payment before sending you a benefit, grant, or refund.
- 6.** The government won't suspend benefits from Social Security or Medicare because someone else misused your identification. Federal law enforcement agents also won't bully you into revealing personal information such as your bank account number.
- 7.** Agencies won't take payments in prepaid gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency.
