From the President's Desk

Dear Cicero residents,

I am happy to report that the President of the United States approved the disaster declaration request that town officials and I initiated during and immediately after the July 2 floodings with the support of many local, county and state officials.

The disaster declaration now brings FEMA into our community to begin helping property owners and residents assess the compensation for the damage.

The day after the White House decision, I immediately contacted FEMA officials to help coordinate their assessment efforts. FEMA teams will be visiting damaged areas and properties for firsthand inspections.

But you don't have to wait until they knock at your door. Visit the FEMA application website today and complete the paperwork at: **www.DisasterAssistance.gov**. There are applications in both English and Spanish.

Property owners should have reported the damage to their insurance companies if they were insured. The insurance company reports will help FEMA assess remaining damage allocations. Those who do not have insurance should report their damage, as they did during our initial effort to secure a disaster declaration when we collected nearly 7,000 damage assessment forms. + + + +

In addition to the FEMA work, the town continues to examine ways we can minimize flood problems by exploring the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District's Green Infrastructure options and urging residents to install water barrels. Four water barrels on every downspout at every home can significantly reduce the pace of water buildup and allow rainwater to drain more quickly.

With support from Cook County Commissioner Frank Aguilar, we are pushing for a bill to give tax breaks to property owners who suffer flooding damage.

Cicero offers funding

to help cover the cost of installing a water backup system that helps prevent water backup in homes.

Unfortunately, heavy rains like the one we experienced – what officials call a one-in-500-year event – are acts of God. Cicero hosted several events to help our residents as we awaited FEMA approval. Despite some who want to exploit the floods for political purposes, we knew that the case we made collecting nearly 7,000 Damage Assessment Reports and securing the support of every elected official in our region made the case for a disaster declaration compelling and certain.

We are grateful for that FEMA support.

FEMA Approves Disaster Assistance for Cicero Residents

Cicero residents can begin applying for FEMA funding for damages caused by the July 2 floods.

Town President Larry Dominick announced that applications were available immediately after the White House announced the disaster declaration on August 15 after the town, regional and state officials presented the federal government with details about the extensive damage to homes and neighborhoods.

"We were always sure we would get this designation as this rain storm was one of the worst we have faced. They described it as a one-in-500-year storm. The town was the first to contact our county, state and federal government officials to join us in calling for a Federal Disaster designation. I am happy to announce it has come through," Dominick said. "Together, our voice and the massive program we launched to help our residents to complete property damage assessments helped make this designation possible. We will work with the community to help them as they apply for FEMA disaster assistance."

Individuals and business owners who sustained losses in the designated areas can begin applying for assistance by registering online at www.DisasterAssistance.gov, by calling 1-800-621-3362, or by using the FEMA App. If you use a relay service, such as video relay service (VRS), captioned telephone service, or others, give FEMA the number for that service.

"I want to thank all the officials who joined our call for FEMA assistance. Governor J.B. Pritzker. Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle. Congressman Chuy Garcia. Metropolitan Water Reclamation District President Kari Steele. Cook County Commissioner Frank Aguilar, State Reps. Lisa Hernandez and Abdelnasser Rashid. Senators Mike Porfirio and Javier Loera Cervantes. Ted Berger, the director of Cook County Emergency Management and Regional Security, and Vince Acevez, Deputy Director of EMRS. I also want to give special thanks to the Red Cross and Team Rubicon for their help," Dominick said, thanking each of the Town Board members, department heads and employees who worked tirelessly to help residents.

"The people of the Town of Cicero are grateful for their

supporting our call for the FEMA disaster declaration."

Cicero collected nearly 7,000 Damage Assessment Forms from property owners, which were used to justify the FEMA decision, and will support residents in submitting their information to FEMA.

Cicero Honors Team Rubicon for Cleanup Efforts

The Cicero Town Board presented members of Team Rubicon with a resolution honoring the group for their volunteer work to help clean up the residents' homes damaged by the July 2 flooding. In addition, Senior Center Director Diana Dominick also presented Team Rubicon with a letter expressing the gratitude of the entire town for their volunteer work.

The resolution and letter were presented to Team Rubicon members at the August 8 Board Meeting.

The town experienced what emergency management officials describe as a once-in-500-years rainstorm flood with record-rainwater floods that damaged thousands of homes in Cicero, Berwyn, Oak Park and portions of Chicago, with officials providing an immediate response to help homeowners to ensure their safety while also pushing for state and federal aid.

"The Town of Cicero welcomed volunteer organizations from around the country who helped, including Team Rubicon, a veteran-led humanitarian organization that serves global communities before, during, and after disasters and crises," the resolution reads.

Team Rubicon began in 2010 to help with rescue and recovery after the 2010 Haiti earthquake that devastated the Caribbean nation. Today, the group has more than 150,000 volunteers nationwide and launched more than 1,100 operations after disasters domestically and internationally.

After the record rainfall over the weekend before Independence Day, Team Rubicon leaders Rick Kolomay and Colin Monk reached out to volunteer in the cleanup efforts for Cicero residents, including many senior residents. Their team helped clean basements and removed the remaining floodwater for more than 110 homes.

During the meeting, Team Rubicon leaders presented President Dominick with a gift that featured every volunteer who helped in the cleanup efforts in the town.

"We got this company that suggested Team Rubicon, and they came out, and they've been doing a magnificent job. My heart goes out to all the people that lost a lot of

stuff. The Town of Cicero will do everything we can. If you have a problem, call Town Hall, and we'll see if we got someone that can come out and help you," Dominick said after the board adopted the resolution.

Dominick had earlier visited one of the homes Team Rubicon worked on, meeting the volunteers and thanking each one of them for their work. He also met with the homeowner to hear more about how the flooding impacted his life and how the town has been able to help.

Cicero Hosts Successful Car Light Repair Program

In partnership with the Cook County Sheriff's Department and Morton College, the Town of Cicero provided free repair services for residents' damaged headlights, tail lights and license plate lights on August 10.

Town Clerk Maria Punzo-Arias and Cook County Commissioner Frank Aguilar coordinated with Cicero Police Deputy Supt. Dominic Schullo to help bring in the necessary partners for the event.

"I put Aguilar in contact with Schullo and President Larry Dominick gave his blessing. We then reached out to Morton College. As you can see, this is a beautiful facility," Punzo-Arias said.

Schullo said he was very proud to be part of making this great event possible.

"President Dominick is one of the most giving people I've ever worked with. He's very good at what he does," he said. "You need to have turn signals, lights so other cars can see other vehicles. You don't want to get into accidents. Car accidents are caused by cars not turning their turn signals on. Then having no headlights, so you can't see in the middle of the night."

Aguilar called the program "lifesaving" while thanking Cook County Sheriff Tom Dart, Dominick and Morton College.

"This is our 12th car repair event in and around Cook County," said Cook County Undersheriff Marlon Parks. "I think the Town of Cicero and Morton College have been remarkable. This is one of the best venues we've worked in because it's convenient for people to get in and out."

Mechanics worked on nearly 60 cars in three hours.

"We are so pleased to be able to open our facilities up for a community service like this," said Dr. Keith McLaughlin, Morton College President. "It just so beneficial to our residents to be able to bring their vehicles in."
