Cicero Welcomes "Three Kings" at End of Christmas Season

Cicero closed the Christmas season with the annual Three Wise Men celebration on January 6 at Cicero Stadium. Families could line up at 4 pm for the evening event, with hundreds of children eagerly awaiting the magi's arrival. These wise men are mentioned in the Gospel of Matthew as having visited Jesus after his birth. In most Christian traditions, the day is known as Epiphany, the realization of Christ's humanity.

"Three Kings Day is an important holiday for Cicero and for many cultures throughout the Americas," said Trustee Victor Garcia, who coordinates the event every year. "I'm thankful for Town President Larry Dominick and my colleagues on the board for recognizing and supporting such an important day."

Volunteers were on hand to help coordinate the Three Wise Men's arrival, which signaled the last gift-giving event of the season. Children lined up to receive toys, a symbolic gesture of the gifts the magi brought to Jesus after his birth.

Children met with the wise men and, later, a special mouse who arrived to bring smiles to everyone's faces as they waited to take pictures. Cook County Commissioner Frank Aguilar and Trustee Blanca Vargas also attended the event. The toys were donated by Toys for Tots.

MWRD President Speaks at MLK Day Commemoration

Cicero honored the civil rights icon, the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., at its annual commemoration on Wednesday, January 15, at the Cicero Community Center.

"These monthly meetings and commemorations are particularly important, especially this one, because President Larry Dominick and the board were the first to implement the recognition of Dr. King's day in Cicero when he was elected in 2005," said Ray Hanania, Cicero's spokesman. "This day is more than just a day off and rather a representation of the achievements Dr. King made towards civil rights."

Hanania thanked everyone for attending, even in the brutally cold weather. He then introduced the emcee: District 201 Superintendent Dr. Tim Truesdale.

"It's interesting that the day is commemorated with school not being in session. There's so much that there is to learn from someone like Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.," said Dr. Truesdale. "Our goal is to make sure that all the rest of the days of the school year everything we do in our schools does honor the legacy of people like Dr. King."

Keri Steele, President of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD), spoke about King's legacy as the primary guest during the event.

"Dr. King, as we know, was a hero because he fought for civil rights, which means he fought for the rights for all of us to do whatever we wanted to do," Steele said, emphasizing the personal liberties afforded in civil rights. "He fought so we all could have the opportunity to be all we can be regardless of our race, color, creed, religion, and who we love, simply because it wasn't right."

The water district is responsible for the sanitation of all the water used in homes and buildings throughout Cook County, ensuring it is cleaned and safe to be released back into the waterways.

"I literally worked my way up from the bottom as an intern, a water sampler, all the way to become the first black woman president of the board," she said.

"During King's day that would not have happened. Without the work and the dream of Dr. King, I would have never been able to dream of being a black girl from the south side of Chicago who ended up being a water chemist."

Steele pleaded with the students present to have dreams and then worked to make dreams come true.






