

Houby Day Brings Out Festive Crowd

Residents showed up to the Cicero Fairgrounds to celebrate Houby Fest during the first week in October, a testament to celebrating the town's long history spanning from the Slovak and Czech settling to the diverse populace that makes up the community today.

Cicero Town President Larry Dominick and members of the Board of Trustees warmly welcomed families and children to the festival, which ran from October 4–8 this year. The Houby Festival stands as a cultural homage to the traditions of the Czech, Slovak, and Bohemian communities. "Houby" is the Czech/Slovak word for "mushrooms," symbolizing the universal experience of the fall harvest shared by many cultures.

Notably, this year's festival was moved to the fairgrounds due to the CTA's construction along the "L" stops. Despite this location change, the celebration showcased the fierce dedication of residents in celebrating the town.

The festival featured an array of carnival rides, multiple entertainment stages, including one showcasing Latino music and entertainment, and a diverse selection of food vendors. On October 8, the 78th Annual Houby Day Parade made its way along Cermak Road, featuring more than 70 floats and various groups.

Participating in the parade were representatives from town offices and departments, including the police and fire departments, community-based organizations, local businesses, and elected officials such as State Rep. Lisa Hernandez and Cook County Commissioner Frank Aguilar.

"I am immensely proud of how the entire town, regardless of where their family originated, come together as a unified community to show pride in being a Ciceronian today," Dominick said.

"These festivals and events invigorate the community, and this enthusiasm, stemming from our families, seniors, and youth, plays a pivotal role in making Cicero one of the safest communities in the Chicagoland region. We are committed to acknowledging and celebrating everyone's unique histories and cultural richness, uniting them in shared appreciation." President Dominick, alongside town officials and representatives such as Clerk Maria Punzo-Arias, Supervisor Joe Virruso, Assessor Emilio Cundari, Collector Fran Reitz, and trustees Victor Garcia, Bob Porod, John Cava, and Blanca Vargas, expressed their deep gratitude to all the groups and businesses that participated in the parade.

Cicero Earns Beautification Honors

In September, the Town of Cicero garnered recognition at the 2023 America in Bloom Symposium and Award Celebration in South Carolina. The town received a grant from America In Bloom/Canadian National to plant a diverse array of trees throughout the community. Tom Tomschin, the Executive Director of the Department of Housing, represented the town at the Symposium and subsequently presented the award. Town President Larry Dominick received the award during the Town Board meeting on October 10.

"The recognition we've received is a direct result of several factors. These encompass the quality of services provided to our seniors, the abundance of community programs and festivals, the cleanliness evident in our streets and alleys, the notable and well-maintained housing stock, and the unwavering dedication of President Dominick to create park spaces and replace trees lost due to disease and infestation," Tomschin said.

Tomschin articulated his commitment to further enhancing the town's aesthetic appeal. He eagerly anticipates collaborating with President Dominick and the Town Board to advance a "Cicero In Bloom Program."



Cicero Testifies at State House Flooding Meeting

On October 12, leadership from the Town of Cicero testified before the Illinois House Energy and Environment Committee during a subject matter hearing entitled "Protecting Chicagoland: Regional Solutions to Building Flood and Climate Resilience." Witnesses included Town President Larry Dominick, Cicero Water Department Director Lido Manetti, and School District 99 Board Chairman Tom Tomschin.

"This catastrophic event had a profound impact on our community, and it is essential to share my perspective to collaborate with the members of these panels in developing a regional solution for the benefit of our constituents in the decades to come," Dominick said in his testimony submitted to the committee.

The flood, of an unprecedented magnitude, resulted in extensive damage to infrastructure, homes, and businesses, causing hardship for our residents, many of whom lost property, possessions, and livelihoods. Despite the challenging circumstances, our community united in an impressive display of resilience and solidarity.

"The climate crisis is evident, and another flood in our western suburbs and the West Side of Chicago is inevitable," said State Rep. Ann Williams (D-Chicago), Chair of the Illinois House Energy and Environment Committee. "The work to reinforce and modernize our infrastructure to enhance community resilience in the face of these challenges must commence immediately and involve collaborative efforts across the region. This is the reason behind today's gathering."

State Rep. Abdelnasser Rashid (D-Berwyn) emphasized that this flooding has been partly attributed to inadequate and aging infrastructure but is amplified by climate change. He stressed the importance of working together to develop regional solutions now, while not facing another emergency, to facilitate effective communication, collaboration, and planning.

President Dominick also detailed the actions taken by the Town of Cicero to address immediate needs following the historic July flooding. These actions encompassed communication, cleanup, disaster relief, and other assistance provided by the Town and its partners. Additionally, Dominick mentioned an ongoing infrastructure assessment to identify long-term solutions to mitigate potential flooding in Cicero.

"I am fully committed to collaborative efforts to implement recommendations for permanent solutions that can enhance our town's preparedness and response to future natural disasters," Dominick said. "Our foremost priority remains the safety and wellbeing of our residents."


