Cicero Fest Brings in Thousands Despite Heat

Cicero families enjoyed an early Fourth of July celebration with Cicero Fest this year. The four-day festival began on Thursday, June 20. The special events staff surpasses their previous efforts each year, creating a bigger and better festival.

The 94-degree weather made it challenging for Cicero families to enjoy all the festivities, and they often did not arrive until sunset.

"This year, the temperature was extremely high; it was kind of unbearable during the day," said Special Events Director Patty Salerno.

Over 12,000 people visited Cicero Fest and enjoyed various live music, including house, rock, pop, and Spanish genres.

"This year, we continued our tradition of having English bands on one stage on the east side of the park and Hispanic music on the west side. This gives the event a different vibe and caters to the whole community," explained Director Salerno.

"Thanks to President Larry Dominick and the board, we always have a great fest with great food and great music," added Salerno.

President Larry Dominick gave away thousands of wristbands to Cicero children, as he does at every festival.

"I'm loving it and I'm thanking President Larry Dominick for the free wristband. I'm having a great time. I've been on rides and it's super fun," said Auriyana Montenegro, a Ciceronian enjoying Cicero Fest 2024 thanks to President Dominick's generosity.

Morton Foundation Awards Cicero Board for Support

The Morton 201 Foundation, which awards scholarships to students in Morton High School District 201, presented Town President Larry Dominick with an award on June 11 for his and the Town Board's support of their mission to help students pursue higher educational goals.

Since 2019, the Morton Foundation has awarded 57 scholarships totaling \$100,000. This year, the Foundation received 54 scholarship applications, the highest to date, and awarded 14 scholarships valued at \$2,000 each to the winning recipients. Morton High School Board Secretary and Foundation President Jessica Jaramillo-Flores said the scholarships were equally divided between Morton East and Morton West students, including one culinary student from each school.

The Morton 201 Foundation Board presented the 2024 Pay It Forward award to President Larry Dominick and the Town of Cicero Board of Trustees on Tuesday, June 11, 2024.

"Today, we want to recognize one of our oldest and longest supporters, the Town of Cicero," Jaramillo-Flores said in addressing the Town of Cicero Board. "Since 2018, the Town of Cicero has repeatedly purchased tables at our Dinner and Theater Nights and has been a corporate sponsor for all four of our Support Local Online Auctions. It has also helped promote the Foundation by posting information about our events in their buildings, on their website, and through their social media pages."

Jaramillo-Flores added, "The Town of Cicero truly believes in the Foundation's mission and efforts and has been a tremendous partner from the beginning. For these reasons, the Town of Cicero has been selected as the 2024 Pay It Forward award recipient."

On behalf of the board, President Dominick accepted the award and thanked Morton High School District 201 and the Morton 201 Foundation for all they do to help students pursue their life and career goals.

"Morton High School and the Foundation dedicate themselves to helping every student. They are very

effective. Their students are our future leaders, and we are honored to support them," said President Larry Dominick. "One of my personal goals has always been to help our students achieve their dreams and goals. Morton High School District 201 and the Morton 201 Foundation are instrumental in making that happen."

Health Department Hosts Women's Health Fair

The annual women's health fair welcomed hundreds of women on May 29 at the Cicero Community Center. The wellness event offered a variety of services to the community.

"We are really grateful for everyone who showed up today. We are offering Tai Chi, sound therapy, B12 shots, and, of course, health screenings," said Director of Public Health Operations Vanessa Parrish. "We also have haircuts and nail trimmings, so it's a nice way for women to pamper themselves a bit."

Women signed up for raffles and received information from various community organizations.

"With the support of our town president, we are able to host these events," said Parrish. "For these types of events, we like to offer more interactive services so everyone can take away something significant and impactful."

Women received medical services inside the gym and participated in different classes.

The Cicero Health Department invited various vendors to provide information to new moms, senior citizens, and everyone in between.

"The focus is on getting everyone the preventive care they need," added Dr. Skurski.

After the screenings, the Cicero Health Department contacts each patient to discuss their results.

Cicero Library Receives State Technology Grant

On June 6, Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias visited the Cicero Public Library to announce a significant development. Over 100 libraries, including Cicero's, are set to receive technology grants. The Cicero Public Library, in particular, will benefit from a substantial grant of \$27,500, which will significantly enhance its technological capabilities.

"It's a pleasure to join you all at this incredible library today," said Secretary of State Giannoulias. "We are here today to announce the allocation of \$2 million in new grant funding for technology for libraries in Illinois. We must do more to help our most vulnerable and least resourced libraries across Illinois."

Giannoulias emphasized the importance of libraries as pillars of their communities, providing essential services, facilitating access to information, inspiring ideas, and fostering a passion for lifelong learning.

This marks the first time the Secretary of State's office has provided grants to libraries.

Giannoulias explained his decision to provide these grants to the most deserving libraries in Illinois. "I had the honor of serving on the board of the Chicago Public Libraries under Mayor Emanuel, and as we traveled the city and state, we saw libraries that were inspirational and beautiful, looking like stadiums. Then, right down the street, you'd find libraries without air conditioning and with lights falling off. That contrast has always stuck with me. Now, as the state's librarian, I am committed to making a dent in these disparities and raising awareness."

"The Town of Cicero, its President Larry Dominick, the Board of Trustees, and I recognize that the many amazing services offered in Cicero, such as the library, are critical to maximizing the services we provide as local governments to all our citizens," said Clerk Maria Punzo-Arias. "As a resident of Cicero and Town Clerk, we are grateful to Secretary of State Alexi Giannoulias for the grant awarded to the Cicero Library to enhance technology services. We also

appreciate the support from Congressman Chuy Garcia, State Rep. Lisa Hernandez, President Larry Dominick, Sandra Tomschin, Director of the Cicero Library, and the Library Board members for their leadership."

This grant will usher in a new era of modernization for the Cicero Public Library. It will enable the implementation of advanced technology features, making the library more accessible and beneficial to our community's children, families, and seniors. The grant's impact on the library's services and facilities is significant and promising.

"I think this grant came at the right time because, with the renovations we've been having, like the makerspace and other offices and conference rooms," said Cicero Library Board President Ismael Vargas. "Technology will enhance these rooms that we have just created."

"The next step is spending it," said Cicero Public Library Director Sandra Thomschin excitedly. "We just finished the construction of our makerspace. Now we're going to purchase a 3D printer, a Glowforge machine, a Cricut machine, a sewing machine, and an embroidery machine, so we can start offering classes."






